ADVISING NOTES FOR JANUARY, SPRING, AND MAY 2012 COURSES

UNIQUE FEATURES

1. *Students may enroll in courses for January Term, Spring Semester, and May Term 2012 beginning on November 8, 2011.*
 - a. The January Term class meets the week before the Spring Semester begins (January 9-13) and involves pre-assignments and/or post-assignments. The registration deadline for the January Course is December 12, 2011.
 - b. The Spring Term meets January 17-May 10, 2012.
 - c. Each May Term course meets for one week (see schedule for dates) and involves pre-assignments and/or post assignments. The registration deadline for on campus May Term courses is April 20, 2012. See the May Term schedule for course descriptions and advising notes.
2. *Two classes will meet on alternating weeks in the same block of time on Thursdays at 1:20-5:30. They are Baptist Heritage and Thought (CHST 6230-A), which meets every other week beginning January 26, 2012, and Evangelism (MNST 6251) which meets every other week beginning on January 19, 2012. The Evangelism course will be taught by Dr. Wayne Shuffield, who is the director of the Missions/Evangelism division of the Baptist General Convention of Texas.*
3. *In the Spring Semester, Students may participate in an international course that will involve travel and mission experiences in Athens, Greece. The trip will occur around the time of Spring Break (March 8-20). See below for more details. Interested students should contact Dr. Ken Lyle for additional details and deadlines. Participants may enroll in either of the following courses in relation to the trip: BIBL 5099-A, Paul's Aegean Experience (3 hrs), with Dr. Ken Lyle or MISS 5099-A, Missions in the Context of Athens (3 hrs), with Dr. Bob Ellis.*
4. *In May Term, Students may participate in an international course that will involve travel and mission immersion experiences in Indonesia. The deadline for course registration is January 20, 2012. See the schedule comments for May Term for more details. Participants may enroll in 3 or 6 hours in connection with this travel course. For more information contact Dr. Rob Sellers.*
5. *Please note that for Mdiv students, registration forms require students to choose a track by checking one of the boxes at the top of the form.*

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS NOT LISTED IN THE CATALOG

BIBL 5099-A, Paul's Aegean Experience (3 hrs)

MISS 5099-A, Missions in the Context of Athens (3 hrs)

As travel courses, BIBL 5099 and MISS 5099 give primary attention to the experience of visiting Athens, Corinth and the Attic peninsula. The dates of the trip are March 10—22. Students will stay in central Athens near the Acropolis, visiting many other historic sites. In addition, students will experience modern Athens. A significant part of the experience will come from participation in various mission activities with different mission groups in Athens: PORTA—a

mission to Albanian immigrants in Athens; Neo Zoe—a ministry to women; the 2nd Evangelical Church of Athens, and others. Students may take one of the two offered courses. There will be two pre-trip class meetings and at least one post-trip class meeting.

THEO 5099-A, Religion & Film (3 hrs)

Students will explore the connections between contemporary, mainstream movies and theology through reading related texts, examining how ethical topics like violence or the role of women are portrayed on screen, and discussing the theological themes such as forgiveness, redemption, hope, and suffering that are embedded in the dozen films we'll view together. Likely weekends (Friday 6-9 p.m., Saturday 9 a.m.-noon) for the class are Jan. 20/21, Feb. 3/4 and 17/18, Mar. 2/3 and 23/24, Apr. 13/14 and 27/28, and May 4/5.

THEO 6099-A, Doctrine of God (3 hrs)

An examination of the doctrine of God, with special attention to contemporary, hotly debated issues such as the suffering of God, the Trinity, and providence and prayer.

MNST 6099-A, Contemporary Preaching Models (3 hrs)

This course will include a review of the preaching styles of contemporary preachers. Students also will prepare and present sermons to the class.

ADDITIONAL ADVISING NOTES FOR MDIV STUDENTS

NOTE: This commentary on courses is intended as an aid in the process of selecting a course schedule and is not intended as a substitute for personal consultation with your faculty advisor. These comments suggest ways in which courses can satisfy degree requirements, but they are not an exhaustive list of all possibilities.

1. Students enrolling in Supervision in Ministry II (MNST 6342-A) should arrange for a field supervisor for the Spring Semester by December 12, 2011. Contact Dr. Heflin to indicate who your field supervisor will be or if you need assistance locating a supervisor.
2. The following course is for MAFM students only: FMIN 6162, Capstone II.
3. The following course is for MDiv students only: THEO 6260, Capstone.
4. The following courses will fulfill the Theology/Church History elective requirement for the MDiv: CHST 6310-A, Advanced Church History: American Christianity; THEO 5099-A, Religion and Film; THEO 5355-A, World Religions; THEO 6311-A, Advanced Systematic Theology; and THEO 6099-A, Doctrine of God (January Term).
5. Worship Leadership (MNST 6270-A) satisfies the MDiv course requirement for a class in worship; however, it **cannot** satisfy the requirement of a course in education, leadership or administration.
6. Contemporary Preaching Models (MNST 6099-A) satisfies the MDiv requirement for an Advanced Preaching course.
7. Instruction Theory and Practice (MNST 6332-A) satisfies the MDiv requirement for a course in Education/Administration/Leadership.

Schedule Comments for May Term 2012
1. BIBL/THEO 6099-A, Amos & Ethics (3 hrs)
Description: A study of the book of Amos focusing on its ethical message and relevance for ministry today.

Degree planning: The BIBL section of this class can count toward degree requirements for a course in Old Testament, and the THEO section can count toward degree requirements for a course in ethics, a THEO designated elective, or a free elective.

2. BIBL 6315-A, NT Exegesis: Mark
Description: Exegesis of the Gospel of Mark. Attention will be given to analysis of form and content.

Degree planning: This 3-hour class can count toward degree requirements for a course in New Testament or serve as a free elective.

3. MISS 6340-A & MISS/THEO 6099-a (3 hrs), Connected to a travel course to Indonesia
Description: Students may enroll in 3 or 6 hours in connection with this 3-week travel course. Consult with the professor about the nature of the trip and the coursework.

Degree planning: MISS 6340-A fulfills a degree requirement for MDiv students in the Missions/Cross-Cultural Ministry track and serves as a Supervision in Ministry course for that track (but not for other MDiv tracks). MISS 6340-A or MISS 6099-A can fulfill a degree requirement for a missions course, and THEO 6099-A can serve as a designated elective in THEO. Either course can serve as a free elective.
